## ERASMUS+ Jean Monnet Module

**‘On-line UGent Academy for Ukrainian Lecturers: EU Law and Policy’**

**CALL FOR PARTICIPATION 2023**

**Deadline: 20 February 2023**

### ***About the course:***

Within the Jean Monnet Module “*On-line UGent Academy for Ukrainian Lecturers: EU Law and Policy*” (UGent\_ACADEMY4UA) **Ghent University offers a certificate course and training for Ukrainian professionals with an interest in EU related disciplines.**

The course consists of 62 teaching hours devoted to different aspects of EU law and policy (history and development of the European integration process; constitutional aspects of the EU; human rights, rule of law, democracy and legitimacy in the EU; EU trade and competition policy; the EU international personality; EU Security and Defence Policy; social policy; Neighbourhood policy; EU and Ukraine) **to be held online between April-June 2023** (see a tentative schedule below). It also includes several workshops to develop and refine transferable skills on planning and writing a grant proposal.

Besides, UGent\_ACADEMY4UA provides a platform to discuss problems of teaching EU law and policy in Ukraine and serves as a tool of academic diplomacy fostering cooperation between EU and Ukrainian academia.

### ***The target group:***

UGent\_ACADEMY4UA is a tailor-made, innovative course specially designed for Ukrainian researchers (PhD students and postdocs) and lecturers/trainers whose professional activity is focused on EU law and policy to meet their teaching and methodological needs. The course will bring together researchers, lecturers and trainers who have the motivation to develop and improve their competences in the field of European studies and who are affiliated with Ukrainian universities/ research

institutes. The participants must commit to the full duration of the course and have a good proficiency of English.

### ***About Ghent University and the Jean Monnet Module's team***

Ghent University (UGent) is a top-ranking university founded in 1817. It offers more than 200 programmes (including 64 English-taught master's programmes) and conducts in-depth research within a wide range of scientific areas.

The Jean Monnet Module (*promoter*: Prof. Van Elsuwege; *coordinator*: Dr. Alina Cherviatsova) involves UGent's leading experts in EU studies affiliated with three research institutes – Ghent European Law Institute (GELI), Human Rights Centre (HRC) and Ghent Institute for International and European Studies (GIES) from two faculties – the Faculty of Law Criminology and the Faculty of Political and Social Sciences.

### ***How to participate:***

All interested candidates need to apply before 20 February 2023 by sending a short bio (300 words max.) and a motivation letter (500 words max.) to [academy4ua@ugent.be](mailto:academy4ua@ugent.be).

Up to 25 Ukrainian scholars, lecturers and trainers will be offered a spot at the UGent\_ACADEMY4UA. All applicants will be notified by 10 March 2023.

Participation in the Jean Monnet Module UGent\_ACADEMY4UA is **free of charge**. Upon successful completion of the course (attendance of 90 percent of classes) the participants will be issued a certificate of attendance.
