



Individual project grants Eligible categories of professionals and priority topics

Sector of culture and creative industries

- Managers, curators, cultural operators, experts, researchers, and cultural entrepreneurs in the fields of music, theatre, dance, design, fashion, visual arts and photography, audio-visual arts (including film), crafts, art market, museums, galleries, libraries, publishing and literature, festivals, creative hubs, cultural heritage, archives, restoration and conservation
- Artists and creative professionals working in the fields of music, theatre, dance, and other performing arts, visual arts and photography, audio-visual arts (including film), crafts, sculpture, media art, concept art, literature, advertising
- Architects, landscape architects, urban planners

Preference will be given to the activities addressing the following topics:

- European visibility for cultural projects
- Network development with EU* counterparts
- Exchange on decentralised cultural policies in Ukraine and the EU*
- Development of digital formats of projects and other relevant COVID-19 response actions in the applicant's organisation or professional community.

Sector of education

- Managers of educational institutions (secondary schools, vocational education and training institutions)
- Teaching staff at all levels of education (secondary school, vocational education and training institutions, university, and post-graduate further education)
- Non-formal education professionals

Preference will be given to the activities addressing the following topics:

- Best practices in educational management; enhancement of management skills
- Exposure to professional cultures outside Ukraine



- EU* practices and principles in education approaches
- Inclusion in education
- New Ukrainian School reform; competence-based learning
- Foreign languages/multilingual education
- Best practices of online education

Sector of health

- Doctors and nurses of family medicine, paediatrics, emergency medicine, and palliative medicine.

Preference will be given to the activities addressing the following topics:

- Modernisation of procedures; international clinical protocols
- Improvement of health care staff skills and competences
- Support from EU* country colleagues on specialised topics, use of modern equipment
- Patient-oriented approach
- Medical ethics

Sector of media

- Managers of regional and local media
- Journalists and editors of regional and local media
- Culture journalists
- Economic journalists
- Investigative journalists
- Fact-checkers

Preference will be given to the activities addressing the following topics:

- Countering the influx of false and manipulative information and hybrid warfare
- Promotion of good values and best practices; journalistic ethics
- Convergence journalism
- Financial sustainability and independence of media
- Culture journalism
- Economic journalism



Sector of social entrepreneurship¹

- Founders of social enterprises, managers and employees in managerial positions of existing social enterprises (juridical person registered, confirmation of sales)
- Trainers, mentors, and university professors who work in the field of social entrepreneurship

Preference will be given to the activities addressing the following topics:

- Network development between social entrepreneurs in Ukraine and EU*
- Scaling/multiplying impact of social enterprises
- Increasing capacity and professionalization of existing social enterprises
- Promoting social entrepreneurship across disciplines, curriculum development

Sector of youth

- Managers and employees of youth centres, youth non-profit organisations, hubs and clusters
- Youth workers of the united territorial communities, regional, district and municipal state organisations

Preference will be given to the activities addressing the following topics:

- Network development between leaders of youth sector in Ukraine and EU*
- Development of new opportunities of youth exchange between Ukraine and EU*
- Capacity building of youth non-profit organisations
- Inclusion in youth sector

¹ Social entrepreneurship – a type of entrepreneurship that simultaneously has an economic effect and measurable social impact: 5-10% of income is distributed for social aims and/or employment of socially sensitive stratum (30% of employees) and/or the main product solves a social problem.
